MGM joins hands to establish Low Carbon Green Hotel Development Alliance



With the aim to promote a low-carbon society to align with climate strategies stipulated in the National 14th Five-Year Plan, MGM joined hands with tourism industries, industry partners and professional to form the Low Carbon Green Hotel Development Alliance (LCGHDA). MGM hosted the inauguration ceremony on December 4, 2021, at MGM COTAI, Macau, China.

The LCGHDA is comprised of over 30 leading enterprises, professional organizations and academic institutions from the Mainland and Macau. It is led by a team of the mainland's green experts, who will guide LCGHDA to work together on the development of low-carbon green tourism in support of our nation's dual carbon goal.




At the ceremony, Ms. Pansy Ho,

Founding Chairperson of the LCGHDA and Co-Chairperson and Executive Director of MGM China Holdings Limited delivered the opening speech. The alliance strives to rally the forces of the hotel industry, in a bid to expedite the industry's transition into a low-carbon operation toward a greener economy, and also to stimulate and maximize the interplay between eco-tourism, green communities and green economies, said Ms. Ho. The representative of Alliance and the Institute of Energy, Environment and Economy of Tsinghua, signed and exchanged the first strategic cooperation framework agreement, marking its first milestone.



After inauguration ceremony, LCGHDA held a seminar, Nation's Dual Carbon Goal, where Wang Youwei, Director of the China Green Building Council and Zhou Jian, Deputy Director of the Institute for Low Carbon Economy Studies of Tsinghua University, shared his insight into the national agenda and its implications on hospitality businesses.



Recently Published Environmental Protection Policy



The Macau Special Administrative Region Bulletin published the Chief Executive's instructions No.122/2021 to prohibit of import and transfer non-degradable disposable plastic catering straws and stirring rods to Macau SAR, starting at Jan 1,2022. Plastic straws and stirring rods has become a thing of the past. It's the next step towards sustainable living. Are you ready for it?

Since mid-December, plastic egg containers without plastic sorting labels can be recycled under the Environmental Protection Bureau (DSPA) recycling scheme! You can bring your undamaged, clean containers to the DSPA recycling stations. The reusable egg containers will be handed over to the supplier after sorting and classification by DSPA. Let's take action together, by using resources wisely and protecting our environment.

MGM Floral Team handmade Christmas decorations


This past Christmas, our amazing Floral team created handmade decorations to spark heartwarming festivity for the most wonderful time of the year!


