MGM MACAU won GOLD in Macao Green Hotel Award again

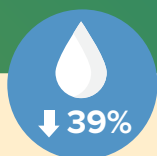


MGM MACAU has once again achieved the Gold Award in the Macao Green Hotel Award, an indication of Environmental Protection Bureau (DSPA) and Macao Government Tourism Office (MGTO)'s recognition of our efforts and dedication towards low-carbon, waste reduction and environmental sustainability. This accolade also holds us on par with MGM COTAL, which has attained the gold award in 2021.

Creating a better planet is our sustainability approach, and we are committed to becoming a green business model in the Greater Bay Area. In order to achieve the goal, we have set a number of ambitious targets and actions, including: 13% energy savings by 2025 when compared to 2019 baseline, reducing 90% bottled water consumption by 2030 when compared to 2018 baseline, and in the long-term to eliminate 100% single-use plastics, etc.

We have made a great progress in 2022, which improving the performance of both water and energy intensity due to our low-carbon operations.

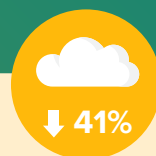
ENVIRONMENTAL PERFORMANCE IN 2022

Awarded "National Key R&D Program Showcase Base" for innovation in sustainable tourism



In June, MGM COTAI has become the first integrated resort in Macau to be awarded the “National Key R&D Program Showcase Base” under the “research on energy efficiency and health performance improvement of building operations based on lifecycle carbon emission reduction”(the Research), which is a key project initiated by the Ministry of Science and Technology (China). This award underscores MGM’s unique role as a showcase for large scale low carbon green building and our continuous efforts in reducing carbon emission and creating a sustainable future for all.

The Research is a key project under China’s “13th Five-Year Plan” for “Inter Government Departments’ International Scientific and Technological Innovation Cooperation” aimed at improving building operational efficiency, reducing carbon emissions and helping China achieve its dual carbon goals. To better align with the Nation’s climate strategy, MGM will provide access to our energy consumption and environmental performance data for industry peers to learn from our experiences.

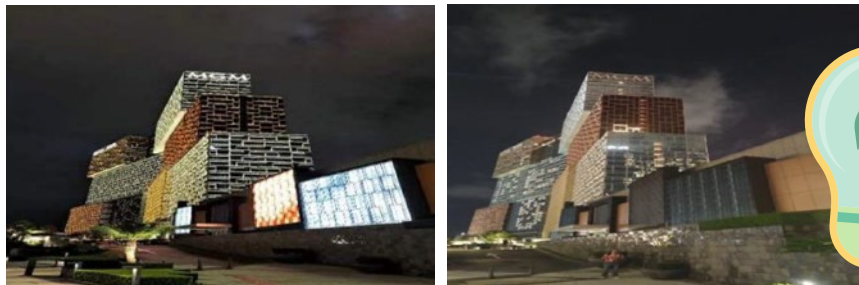

DID YOU KNOW?

Subsidy for electric vehicles

DSPA launched the 2nd phase of “Subsidy Scheme for Phase-out of Old Diesel Vehicles” and “Subsidy Scheme for Phase-out of Old Motorcycles and Replacement with New Electric Motorcycles” from June 1, 2023, to encourage more car owners to phase out polluting vehicles and replace with electric vehicles. It performs better, reduces direct emissions, improves air quality and protects our own health.

As of July 31, 2023, there are more than 2,000 charging facilities for electric vehicles and 590 for electric motorcycles in 49 public parking lots and roads in Macau. There are 6,878 electric vehicles, including 3,770 light vehicles, 838 heavy vehicles, 1,706 heavy motorcycles and 564 light motorcycles.
